## CHESS

Students will be introduced to the game of chess, developing logical thinking, self-confidence and the ability to concentrate in a stimulating, structured and fun environment. Each lesson includes instruction at the start of class, purposeful practice, and review. The chess teaching program has nine levels, from beginners to advanced players. Part of every lesson is actual chess play with the instructor supervising the games and offering tips and advice. Exercise sheets are provided each week and at the end of each course a certificate of achievement is awarded to each student.

## ROBOTICS

Students will work in teams to design and build functional robots, machines, and robotic animals using software to plan, design and engineer, test and modify sequences of instruction from a variety of real-life robotic behaviours. Introduction to concepts in engineering and robotic movement, kinematics, working with motors, and installing gears and sensors will tap into the child's innate desire to explore, problem solve, create, investigate and learn. No previous robotics experience or exposure is needed.

## SPEECH WRITING CLUB
